Subject: Volunteer Citizen Appointments to the Chatham-Kent Board of Health

Recommendation

It is recommended that:

1. Evan Rogers and Stephanie Harper be appointed to the Chatham-Kent Board of Health for a four-year term effective January 1, 2025.

Background

The Chatham-Kent Board of Health is made up of four current members of Council, appointed by Council following each municipal election; two citizen appointments; one provincial appointment; and one Indigenous representative.

Comments

Historically, the Board of Health has recommended that citizen appointments be for four-year periods that straddle the municipal election cycle in order for continuity to be maintained in the event that all municipal appointees are replaced after an election. Thus, citizen appointees selected now would serve until December 31, 2028.

Recruitment for the two provincial appointee positions was conducted via media release, posting information to the Municipal website, communication through social media, and through community partners. Applications were accepted from July 2, 2024, through August 8, 2024.

Applications were reviewed and scored against a matrix that included prior board experience, community connections, and skills and competencies in the areas of leadership, collaboration, administration, finance, communications, strategic planning, governance, risk management, working with other levels of government, and experience working with priority populations. The top four candidates were interviewed on October 2, 2024.

The interview panel included: the Chair, Chatham-Kent Board of Health; General Manager, Health and Human Services; Acting Director, Chatham-Kent Public Health; and the Executive Assistant, Health and Human Services.

The following individuals were the top two candidates and were unanimously recommended by the panel to sit from January 2025 through December 2028 as the Community Representatives on the Board of Health.

Applications were accepted in both electronic and hard copy format. Advertisement of the positions took place in a variety of mediums and over an extended period to allow interested individuals ample time to obtain and complete an application form.
