Background

The Municipality of Chatham-Kent appointed Spriet Associates Inc. to prepare an engineer's report under Section 4 of the Drainage Act to provide a new drainage system and pumping scheme. Tenders were called and received by the Purchasing Officer on June 17, 2021. The results tender T21-281 were as follows:

The tenders have been reviewed by the Drainage Division and found to be complete. The estimated construction cost contained within the engineer's report is \$355,292.00 (not including HST). Accordingly, it is recommended that the tender in the amount of \$314,192.00 (not including HST) be awarded to the low bidder, Mark G. Contracting Ltd.
