## Recommendation

It is recommended that:

 The Transfer Payment Agreement between the Ministry of Long Term Care and the Corporation of the Municipality of Chatham-Kent authorizing the funding and delivery of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program: COVID-19 Resilience Stream for Long Term Care at no cost to the Corporation be approved.

## **Background**

A new temporary COVID-19 Resilience stream with over \$3 billion available in existing funding was created to provide provinces and territories flexibility to fund quick-start, short term projects that might not otherwise be eligible under the existing funding streams. The priority focus of the grant funding was for upgrades/replacement of heating, ventilation, and air conditioning units. Eligible projects would improve ventilation in public infrastructure assets such as long term care homes that serve a population more susceptible to poor outcomes if contracting COVID-19.

#### **Comments**

In January 2021, Riverview Gardens Long Term Care submitted an application to the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program COVID-19 Resilience Stream. The application included upgrades related to the HVAC System for Humidifier and Ultraviolet Lights. The Ultraviolet Light Upgrade Project would assist in killing airborne viruses in each of the six air handlers.

On April 16, 2021, the Municipality was notified of the successful application and would receive funding as follows for the Ultraviolet Light Upgrade only.

Details on the grant and the Transfer Payment Agreement were received on April 30, 2021. The agreement had to be executed and returned by May 12, 2021 so the Director of Senior Services and the General Manager, Community Human Services signed the agreement.

Therefore, it is recommended that the Transfer Payment Agreement between the Ministry of Long Term Care and the Corporation of the Municipality of Chatham-Kent authorizing the funding and delivery of the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program: COVID-19 Resilience Stream for Long Term Care at no cost to the Corporation be approved.

The agreement stipulated that the project must be substantially completed on or before December 31, 2023.
