





Focus on broader and more evidence informed community

Communication strategy - shift from 'push' via emails, to more interactive communications; working with communications specialist to assess needs and options, and roll out of full communications plan in 2022.

and hire leaders in this field, CYPN hopes to engage these leaders in increasing knowledge and capacity for all member organizations.

As well as, analyze our current membership through a Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion lens to determine who we are missing. We will be looking at how we can actively recruit voices needed in 2022.

Continue to provide members with an opportunity to better understand and use the Human-Centred Design approach.

Continue to build awareness of the Advocacy Working Group and how they can support movements, projects, and organizations.

To provide 50 peer consultation/ pitch presentation opportunities over the course of this year and have member organizations establish new partnerships as a result of CYPN activity.
